


Update on Garbage Can Rules

At a recent Board Meeting a member pointed out to the Board that work, vacation or illness may cause members to put out toters earlier or leave out toters later than normal. This sometimes causes members to get rules enforcement letters.

The Association listened. We checked with the city and learned that the city code now references clearing the streets for street cleaning instead of specific hours for toters.

The Association will continue to enforce the rule that toters should be stored out of sight when not on the street for pick-up day and WILL respond to community complaints about toters left in the street for extended periods but will give residents a bit more flexibility on when toters are put out and pulled in in recognition of individual schedules and needs.

The Association invites members to attend Board meetings and to bring up issues that will make life in the Association a better experience for all.
